

## Enrollment Eligibility Options

Prepared by the Office of the Secretary of State – January, 2020

Enrollment Status of Voter	Can I enroll in a party on Election Day?	When is my new party effective?	Can I change my party enrollment on Election Day?	How long must I stay in the new party?	When can I file an application to withdraw enrollment or change my enrollment to a new party?
<b>Unenrolled</b>	Yes, fill out an application to enroll in a party. Options: Democratic – D Green Ind. – G* Republican – R	Same Day	N/A	3 months from the date of enrollment	Anytime after 3 months from the date of enrollment
<b>Enrolled in a party (D, G or R) less than 3 months</b>	N/A	N/A	No, you must stay in the party for at least 3 months	3 months from the date of enrollment	Anytime after 3 months from the date of enrollment
<b>Enrolled in a party (D, G or R) more than 3 months</b>	N/A	N/A	No, you must file application to change enrollment at least 15 days prior to the election. For the 3/3/20 Pres. Primary and Special Referendum Election, the deadline is <b>Monday, February 17, 2020</b> (February 17 <sup>th</sup> is a federal and state holiday; if the municipal office will not be open on the 17 <sup>th</sup> , the application to change enrollment must be received in the Registrar's office on the last day business day before that date.)	N/A	Anytime; however, the effective date for your new party will be 15 days from the date you file your application to change enrollment.

\* **Note:** The Green Independent Party is not participating in the March 3, 2020 Presidential Primary Election. Green Independent voters may not change enrollment and participate in another party's primary unless they have filed applications to change enrollment on or before February 17<sup>th</sup>.

**Voters requesting enrollment changes must complete a new voter registration application.** The old enrollment change cards are no longer authorized, and they should have been discarded by now.

## What Ballot Do I Get?

17 and <b>will</b> turn 18 on or before November 3, 2020	Yes – if enrolled as a D or R, I get that party's ballot	No	No
18 and <b>not</b> enrolled in the Democratic (D), Green Independent (G) or Republican (R) Party (i.e. registered as “unenrolled” voter)	No, unless I enroll as a D or R, and then yes – the ballot for the party I'm enrolling in ( <i>no 15-day waiting period</i> )	Yes	Yes
18 and enrolled in the Democratic or Republican Party	Yes, for the party I'm enrolled in. I <b>cannot change</b> enrollment and vote in another party ( <i>15-day waiting period would apply</i> )	Yes	Yes
18, a <b>township voter</b> , and enrolled in the Democratic or Republican Party	Yes, for the party I'm enrolled in. I <b>cannot change</b> enrollment and vote in another party ( <i>15-day waiting period would apply</i> )	Yes	No
Voters enrolled in or enrolling in the Green Independent Party	No – the Green Independent Party is not participating in the Presidential Primary	Yes	Yes

### Note about Inactive voters:

- Inactive voters who are not enrolled may enroll in a party on Election Day in order to participate in that party's Primary – there is no 15-day waiting period.
- Inactive voters who were enrolled in a party at the time Inactive status was designated may participate in that party's Primary; they may not change enrollment on Election Day and vote in another party, because the 15-day waiting period will apply.

### Question 1: People's Veto

A "Yes" vote rejects the new law and maintains religious and philosophical exemptions to immunization requirements.
